
About Plan Bridgeport




- Plan Bridgeport is the process driving the creation of the City's Master Plan of Conservation and Development




Bridgeport's Arts and Culture

Mayor's Neighborhood Arts & Heritage Grants support creative arts and heritage projects and programs of individual artists and arts-, cultural-, heritage- and history-based organizations throughout the City of Bridgeport, CT and is administered by the Bridgeport Arts + Cultural Council.

The purpose of this program is to enrich the quality of life in the City by funding arts and heritage projects and programs.





Bridgeport's Arts Trail

Four day event highlighting local artists, galleries and installations in Bridgeport.

In 2017, the 9th annual Bridgeport Art Trail weekend attracted 3,500 attendees to tour the city, visiting arts venues such as artists' studios, galleries, theatres and pop-up storefronts.

Bridgeport Arts Fest

- Celebrates the broad ethnicities in Bridgeport with artisans, live music and artwork, local eats, and more!
- A community celebration of local and original arts, artists, makers, and performers
- Features local and original fine art, crafts, jewelry, clothing & accessories, live music, dance, performances, demonstrations and activities, and local food.



















Case Studies in Arts and Culture as Economic Drivers





Canton, OH Arts District

- Canton, Ohio was suffering in the 1990's as many businesses moved away due to crime and economic and social unrest.
- The City of Canton shifted its focus to arts in 2006 through the creation of a county-wide arts council "ArtsinStark" to program its arts venue, the Cultural Center for the Arts.















The Cultural Center for the Arts and ArtsinStark

- At first, programming and management was limited and the center was mainly unused except for large scale events
- 2005 Fund for the Arts Campaign collective fundraising for all artists big and small as a protected unit through the Council
- Collective fundraising from the council of public art, art classes, SmArts programs, and development of the Arts District









Development of Canton Arts District

- The Downtown Canton Land Bank and Downtown Canton Special Improvement collaborated to place local artists in downtown buildings that were otherwise vacant which led to the creation of successful art galleries leased to artists at lower rates
- Arts District was created in collaboration with the Downtown Canton Special Improvement District
- The Canton Arts District boasts 30 art galleries, studios, and specialty shops plus a wide range of public artwork on display around the streets of Downtown Canton! There are also five live music venues, and over 20 restaurants and bars for you to enjoy.









Effects of the Arts District

- Properties were made available from the Land Bank for affordable housing for artists and young professionals
- Presence of artists increases attractiveness of living in in an urban setting – artists are seen as urban pioneers
- Downtown Arts District is outshining the Football Hall of Fame as the star of the city's entertainment value
- Changing perception that Downtown Canton is unsafe as the revitalization spills out from the Arts District to neighboring streets and blocks – people have started living downtown again!







Creating a Community Culture


- A survey of more than 1,200 hightechnology workers looked at the factors that determined a city's appeal when considering a new job. The study found that "community quality of life" was the second most important factor, just below salary.
- How can Bridgeport utilize arts and culture to create a livable, artistic, and energized community?




